An excellent weekend with a Vineyard Church that has not only played an excellent role in that particular movement but has also explored other areas of the Kingdom that allowed it to develop at new height in the purpose of God. Vision is not only about the direction in which we are going but also about our understanding the height at which He wants us to travel with Him.

I spoke on ***“Renewing Our Spiritual Lens,”*** which really is the first stage in learning the importance of every work, church, city and nation moving forward to determine the elements of reformation that will change not only the landscape we are moving into but also who we are going to become as we occupy that new territory. Lack of personal restoration prevents us from corporate reformation and compels us to wander around a wilderness of our own indeterminate behavior where we cannot enter into new territory because we are incapable of settling it in a way that would glorify the Lord and generate a Kingdom corporate reality.

Israel coming out of bondage in Egypt could not be converted from a rabble of slaves to a disciplined army that could take territory. We need a theology that empowers us to know who God is for us, who we are personally in Christ and who we are becoming together in the Holy Spirit.

A new lens is essential if we are to stop being blind to all our own possibilities, both individually and corporately. This was a message given to local and regional leaders and facilitated a lively Q&A that opened up hearts and minds in a new way to what God is doing. Most people and groups want new but think old. That elderly mindset can often be governed by a perspective that's out of date or irrelevant and so we don't have the language for new growth and opportunities. We are stuck in the past, feasting on past glories but with no appreciable idea of the wonders to come.



I spoke on ***“Favor That is Birthed in Relationship”*** and ***“Training For Favor”*** in the new covenant. Favor is a special preference from one to another. An advantage given. An intentional bias. To be considered as favorite. To be unduly loved, esteemed and blessed by a Higher Power. To be privileged and therefor to live in a higher place than the accepted norm. Favor comes to us because of our placement in Christ not because of our performance personally in the things of God. We cannot initiate more favor because of what we do. It is a gift to us because Christ is in us.

We train in favor using all our life situations and circumstances. Favor opens our eyes, requires our thinking and gives us a new language of confession, declaration, and proclamation in the will of God. We must see favor in the way that the Father wants to release it. Favor is more than an event or an impartation for the moment. It is a lifestyle of ever increasing, always expanding permission that upgrades our relationship with the Godhead and opens us up to the rightful status of Jesus in the context of Kingdom.

Favor establishes a process, a series of steps that allow us to rise up and occupy our circumstances using the promises and prophecies given to us. In favor we develop them by the Spirit into a place of reality and fulfillment. Every circumstance can lead us into fresh favor as we discover the depth of God's intention for us. Favor empowers us to contend against our own negativity, our traditions, learned behaviors and the aspirations of the enemy towards the body of Christ.

“Discovering the Father’s Favor”

I made a DVD for the Sunday morning services entitled, **“Prayer In the New Covenant.”** Between Jesus (Hebrews 7:25) and the Holy Spirit (Romans 8:26-27) is a place to stand where we can learn to pray with God not just towards Him.

Jesus prays our future and our permissions/outcomes. The Holy Spirit as Comforter empowers our process at the visceral level of walking out our salvation. How do we bring down the realities of Heaven into the issues of life in a world that has little or no Presence? In praying with God we are changed as we learn the prayers that open up power and direction. We become more as we practice the joyful art of praying with persistence and confidence in the will of God.

We become open and attentive to God in a deeper way because crafted praying with God enables us to determine His thoughts and intentions, and cultivate actions in line with what He wants to release...we become the people who can receive what He is praying for in our circumstances. In that context we get to rejoice in anticipation of hearing God and to practice giving thanks until we become thanks in expectation of moving into a powerful expectation of experiencing the outcome He desires. Prayer becomes not just something we do but the natural outflow of a relationship constantly upgraded by the kind intentions of His will.

Prayer is a relational space that we step into as we join with Jesus and the Holy Spirit in approaching the throne of grace. We are a three-fold chord of relationship guaranteeing that we are not broken by our circumstances but re-forged in them to occupy a higher place of Kingdom reality. Heaven comes to earth as we pray with God not just towards Him.

A great weekend with an excellent church. I believe an apostolic door has opened for me here. Please pray that the Lord will strengthen this connection for His own purposes.

“I finally realized what God wanted me to do...”



A few months ago my wife started listening to Graham's teachings. My wife (who is in TWC - Estella Rosas) would play his messages at the house. - "There are two processes of freedom, one to get free and the other to stay free." This immediately spoke to my heart. How easy is it to forget the processes of God and begin living life on our own terms! The Kingdom of God is always moving forward and God's desire is that we don't get complacent and comfortable but that we continue growing into the image of His son, Jesus Christ. The great value in staying free is that people will begin seeing Jesus Christ in us. We preach not by words only but on how we live our life.

"Our job is to bring the goodness of God." I agree. How can we lead people to Jesus if when they look at us (Christians) all they see is whining and complaining? I like when Graham looked at the congregation and said, "If you're doing this, stop it!", followed by a giggle. When he spoke, it was with love and softness. The Bible says that it is the goodness of God that leads us to repentance. Sometimes we think that we need to be harsh to lead people to Jesus, or we say "it's the truth" but still do things with harshness. This can push people further away from the things of God. I've learned to be more loving, more compassionate, and more patient with

We have a Comforter assigned to us because God intends to take us well out of our comfort zone!


In my second session I spoke on the ***“New Man Theology.”*** The next revival can only come to a people who are practicing a habitational lifestyle in Jesus. For that to happen we must have a new reformation. The church must pull away from a negative, visitational relationship built almost entirely on the old man that God has taken great pains to kill off in Christ. The new man has an identity in Jesus that empowers to live from a higher place than the world. We must learn to live the life that is seated with Christ in heavenly places lifestyle.

It provoked the usual response of delight in some because they could see a clear way forward for their churches, and consternation in others because of all the work they could envisage in this vital transition. The point often can be lost for some people in that we are working extremely hard on the old man for absolutely no reward and we are running ourselves into the ground in this never-ending cycle of going nowhere.

Transition is a positive endeavor because we have an agreed destination and a specific measurable outcome. Some people initially challenged the theology more on the basis that they had heard nothing like this in x amount of years in preaching. However, a man I admire greatly as a relational/academic theologian was delighted with the messages I gave at the whole event. He has recently written a book; “What is Wrong With Protestant Theology.” Dr. Jon Mark Ruthven has also written a book about the anti Holy Spirit doctrine of cessationism, a powerful technical tool that demolishes the cessationist doctrine.


In the main conference I spoke on “**Renewing Your Spiritual Lens**,” a talk that is fast becoming a series. It is opening up all the time; there is so much breath upon it. It is seriously pointing to the fact that we need a new reformation to restore us to the classic spirituality of, “Christ within, the expectation of glory.” Everything comes from a habitation encounter that opens up hundreds of fresh experiences in the Lord as an ongoing part of salvation both as a story and a journey.

In my heart I feel that we must have a reformation before we can have a revival. The revival must be built upon the new man and a strong habitation experience so that we can bring down the favor and upgraded lifestyle of a resident Jesus into our society and culture.

My last session was the “**Roots of Passion**,” drawn from the 2014, Anaheim conference entitled Radical Permission 2. This is part teaching session and part prophetic word about how delighted God is in His passion towards His people. The prophetic word becomes a powerful devotional aide; an influential guide to the nature of God directed at us, and a commanding mindset with which to overcome every circumstance with a prevailing intentionality.

I believe that the assignment was achieved in a larger way than we imagined and that some doors have opened that we did not foresee. Definitely, some God surprises at this event.

Making Deposits as We Travel

This month, I had the delight of visiting Westlake Village, CA again with a second IGNITE workshop: Joyful Intentionality. Our host and TWC member, Connie Jennings, has a passion for community and along with her husband Jeff, a gift of hospitality. It was also a joy to partner with Bob and Barb Book, who bring a powerful atmosphere that does some fire-starting of its own.

IGNITE is still a relatively new adventure, only a few months old. It's a living experiment that continually asks "What is possible?" in partnering intentionality, equipping and permission. I'm just beginning to realize the expansive freedom in knowing that you're in an exploratory season - and it's incredibly renewing.

Programs make all the decisions up front. The path is already decided and the curriculum is written. But in exploration, purpose is defined by values, principles and knowing God's permission to go forward. The journey begins with basic equipment and a sense of direction, but the details come as you travel.

Sound familiar? Of course. TWC was created and continues to expand in the same way. It's the foundation of being a living organism, not an organization.

For me, IGNITE has been a wonderful immersion in the freedom that comes with exploration. There's no sense of pressure because it doesn't exist in this context. It's all learning, observing, experimenting and processing. The testimonies that we're hearing tell us that we're encouraging and empowering people, not just at our gatherings, but in the weeks and months that follow. That's good. In the meantime, we're finding what works and what would work better; adjusting and growing.

Freedom from pressure allows room for expanding vision. This weekend, I could see more clearly that IGNITE, like much of the Kingdom, has several layers. The worship and the word imparted had a sense of being much larger than the room or for the

number of people present. Wherever we go, we have the potential to make a deposit. Often, we may not see much evidence of its immediate impact, but the intensity of His intentionality tip His hand at work in something greater. There's a sweetness in understanding that He trusts us to steward what we are just beginning to see from His perspective.

What I saw this month was that, in addition to teaching and activating, we are leaving deposits and digging wells - Kingdom "dots" to be connected in the future in ways we have yet to imagine.

It is the first time that Bob Book and I have partnered at an IGNITE. I'm thankful that we'll be together again in June for the IGNITE session in Reno. Heaven to earth worship with a good friend is opening up new territory to explore... and we'll continue to be doing just that.

Consider the areas of your world in which you are making deposits as you travel. Be encouraged that often, that is our Kingdom Assignment in our homes, work places or regions. It will be God's job to connect them, but enjoy the freedom of exploration as you create sacred spaces for His world to invade ours.

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I was last in this city in 2009. I have given prophetic words over this region and have some considerable investment here.

Steve Witt, a senior leader of Bethel, Cleveland and I met in Toronto in 1995, and have become very good friends. There is a group of pastors developing relationship together for the sake of developing a Kingdom culture throughout the region. Our first session was over breakfast where Steve interviewed me for 90 minutes.

We had questions on hyper-grace, revival, leadership, church building plus the always inevitable, “how to” questions about fixing problems, issues etc. mostly in a relational context. It was a very productive and interesting morning, which gave me the opportunity to speak outside and beyond the box of people’s conceptual understanding.

Wisdom speaks to the heart of the matter, providing a key with which to unlock and release something new or different. It draws on a perspective from a higher level and formulates a mindset that can get the job done in a new and living way.

I spoke on “***Renewing Your Spiritual Lens***” and the value of having no distortions in our image of Jesus, ourselves and the work of God we represent. We must do the job the same way that Jesus would if He were engaged with us. It is a mystery to me that the one place where we are not true to Jesus is in what we are building in His name! To build a church or ministry without the appropriate foundations being rooted in the Kingdom makes everything we are doing vulnerable to the elements of the world.

Whatever God orders, He pays for. It’s one of the ways that He can exercise His rights over what we are doing or becoming. There is nothing that creates a dialogue faster than a lack of resources. It brings people to the table of innovation, reformation and reinvention, where we begin to seek new directions and practices.

In many cases lack of funding persists until we abandon all our revenue streaming plans and get rich quick schemes and begin to look at the gaping holes in our theology, practice and relationship with utmost Presence. This message provokes the need for a deeper, wider dialogue on how the church could and should move forward.

My third subject was on the subject of **“Reframing.”** Our current mindset and thought practices must come to the place where they are governed by the kingdom within and not the external world of our circumstances. Being empowered to think like Jesus changes our view of things and enables us to come to the Father in a new way. The renewal of our mind is the very essence of transformation. Most people truly want new but are still held captive by the old ways of thinking. We need to reframe our thinking into an alliance with the mind of Christ.

The next day I spoke on **“Relational Thinking”** and how we are being trained by the Holy Spirit to think from our placement in Jesus and our portrayal of that in all our life and ministry issues.

God must have the pre-eminence (Colossians 1:18) in all things. Seeing everything in the context of His relationship with us will put a whole new context on our circumstances and allow us to ask questions in line with Who God is in Himself; Who He wants to be for us now, and who we get to become in the context of what He is doing and building. This creates a framework, a scaffolding around us that enables us to build and create something different. Every situation in God’s heart is primarily relational. Our thinking must have the same ambience and connection.

The fifth session was a Q&A designed to enable people to ask questions about what they are learning. We must not send people home with too many questions if they have no access there to a discipling support system. We must mentor them in the event and allow them some breathing space to engage with the process of changing. This is achieved by creating a Fatherly atmosphere where we can hear His heart and settle down in ours.

Some building conferences also need to consolidate what people are learning so that they are not left overwhelmed and feeling powerless to change so many things at once. There is a framework for change that a wise master builder knows and implements. A flexible plan that we are working to internally and externally that allows the Holy Spirit to control the speed and development of our upgrades so that we make new gains and keep them.

“The Questions That God Asks of Us”

In a movie, the big picture framework must work through a series of smaller scenes to chronicle the story and achieve the outcomes. In constructing a physical building there are always moments where we need to allow the structure to flex, settle and combine together before the next round of development can begin. There are some necessary tensions that we must take into consideration. Foundations have to dry out thoroughly, brickwork has to bond and strengthen, and woodwork must fit together by mortise and tenon joints; not just nailed together quickly. Tension does not mean there is something wrong, it means that something is happening. There is no movement without tension. We cannot even pick up a coffee cup or a knife and fork unless our fingers are in appropriate tension. Navigating appropriate tension is the role of a wise master builder.

My final session was on, ***“The Questions That God Asks of Us.”*** Questions allow us to process current events differently so we can explore our current circumstances to better understand what God might be doing that we had not considered. We can therefore discover God in ways that we had not imagined before and realign ourselves with the kind intention of His will (Ephesians 1:5-12). Full purpose is huge with intentionality.

Questions become navigational tools that allow us to reshape our story and travel in a new direction. They allow people to get to know one another in a more intimate way. They provoke wisdom.

Almost all of the major navigational changes of course in my own life have begun with the Lord asking me a question. In this session I explore some of my own questions and where they have led me, and finish by asking some interesting questions for people to take away and begin in a dialogue with God and one another.

Two super events, each challenging in their own way but hugely enjoyable in the Holy Spirit. Some good friendships that have gone deeper, lots of eyes opened and mindsets put on alert. There remains the intriguing possibility of new relationships forming and new doors opening.

Thanks for being in this fight. My health, as ever, is an object of warfare but not the subject of God’s intention. He is resolutely both my Healer and my Keeper. I’m in good hands.
