TWC Training Day Anaheim 2014 – Q&A with Graham Cooke



Q: You have spoken of doors being knocked on and suddenly you are in the middle of a wide open space, no floors, ceilings or walls. Do you feel TWC is already in that wide open space and exploring or on the brink of another wide open space?

Graham: We're in this huge space and I think maybe the topography is going to change. It feels to me like we've come into this wide open space and we've been on this plain, crossing this plain, and I think now there's an incline we're going up, and I see mountains ahead. I see some really interesting tests for us in this space. Mountains are a test. You have to find a pass or you have to climb the thing, but I see some interesting tests ahead of us, which I think is really exciting.

I think we're going to come into a tough time, but I also think we're acclimated enough to be excited about that. Some of us have had a tough time just shaking stuff off and learning how to think differently and learning how to walk this territory in a different way. We're going to have to, at some point, make a boat to get over this sea. We're going to have to climb these hills.

As always, the God of grace and goodness, who is full of laughter, will be with us. He'll probably get a bigger chance to laugh at us! But we are born for this thing.

It's going to be interesting. I think the dynamic of TWC will change. I don't think the spirit of it will change at all. I think that will continue to grow, but the dynamic of how we assimilate certain types of people and so on may change.

The landscape that is coming into TWC is going to be pretty cool! Some of the people we pick up are going to be very interesting, and God has brought them to change us as much as for us to change them. It's all a part of our development!

It's about possessing your possessions. There are things in this space that the Lord is saying, "I want you to go down this road because there are things I want you to have. I want you to climb that mountain because there is something at the top for you. I want you to swim that river because you're going to see something on the riverbed and I want you to drag it to shore..."

You need this conflict, because when you rout the enemy, the goods that you plunder will be really helpful to you.

So it's important that we don't blast through this territory. We don't saunter through it, either, but we go through it at the pace that God wants, and we should be super aware of what the Lord is giving to us and what it feels like to take territory and hold it.

You need to put things in that space that is opening up. Some of those possessions, some of those promises need to become real.

The biggest thing in the Promised Land was fighting the giants and dispossessing the enemies that were there. The whole point of fighting the giants is so that you can realize how big you are and how big you're becoming.

So in the territory that opens up, a lot of that stuff is going on, and you have to live in that space and occupy it because you need to be ministering out of what you will come into. You can't bring people into a space that's not been lived in. This is where you get to be somebody. It's really mostly about that because this territory is your internal space that you carry with you wherever you go. We're all growing up into Christ in TWC and He's big territory.

Preparation for Advance

What makes a good fight is that we go in convinced that we are not going to lose. Often, we suffer defeated because we cannot see the outcome before the battle. So we need to see the outcome before we start the fight. There are three areas of our life that need to line up with the intentionality of the Lord:
Perception, mindset and language.



The Perception of Majesty

In the anatomy of preparation for battle, we must first see it in the way that God sees it. Perception is really vital to hearing. What we see controls what we hear, and that revelation must open our heart to God's reality. We need to be seeing what God has prepared for us in this issue, and that's an important thing to do right off the bat.

The enemy sometimes comes at you hard and fast because he wants to get a reaction from you that's anxious, worried, fearful and insecure. He wants all of that because that's the opposite of the fruit of the Spirit. The enemy wants you to have eyes on him and on the battle that *he* wants to fight. He wants to give you a vision of yourself as helpless and hopelessly inadequate. That's never going to be true because you're in Jesus, right?

God intends to overwhelm you with His majesty and supremacy. So worship is our intimidation to the enemy. Respond to a fight with worship first! Warfare is not primarily about taking authority over the enemy. It's about discovering the sovereignty and the supremacy and the majesty of Jesus. Please don't allow yourself to be deflected from worship.



The Mindset of New Territory

The next battleground that you face is you have to win the internal fight for your mindset. Caleb had a mind set on majesty. His thinking was that, "I don't see anything out there to worry me, but the enemy needs to be seeing something here that worries him." That's my preparation. *Set your mind on the things of the spirit, not the flesh.*

Sometimes I think we're more concerned with surviving the conflict than we are about prospering from it. If I'm going to fight the enemy, I want something out of it. I want to establish my internal and external territory more and more. I want to know what God wants to give me in that conflict because I want the enemy to pay. It's not enough to beat him, I want to put my foot on his neck and say to him, "This is what you get for attacking me!"

For those who live according to the flesh have their outlook shaped by the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit have their outlook shaped by the things of the Spirit.

What do we get to inherit in any conflict? What territory could become yours? We stand in this space and we occupy it in our standing in Jesus, and we learn how to prosper in it because majesty is with us. It's a mindset.

Rejoicing is a key factor in warfare. 1 Corinthians 15:57 says *Thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.* This whole idea that we are engaged in warfare is so that we can win the victory—and the Bible says that victory is a gift!

Look at Jesus before you look at a problem— all kinds of gifts are available to us in Him. Wisdom is a gift, righteousness is a gift, victory is a gift. God gives us the victory.

The Language of The Overcomer You Are

We have to learn the language of an overcomer. Paul had that language down in Philippians 4:13, *I can do all things in Christ.* He had a language that would not allow him to contemplate or to confess a defeat. "No, I can do ALL things in Christ who strengthens me!"

What is your new man in Christ saying about your current circumstances? When you express anxiety, fear, and so on, which self is talking? That's not your new man! That would be your old one. You have to choose which version of yourself you are going to see this next level in. You can have new but still be perceiving, thinking and talking from the old man.

That's the road ahead of each of us. That's what we're learning. All transition provokes a process and often, a fresh level of warfare. The anatomy of a good fight is perception, mindset and language all lined up with sovereignty. It's in your DNA to be unstoppable. It's in your DNA to be an overcomer. You are genetically disposed to overcome, take new territory and occupy it in peace, joy and delight!

A Coach's Mindset



A coach has the unprecedented power, position, and privilege to speak into the lives of others. Stop and think for a moment of how you would define a coach? Take a moment to write your definition. Does your definition describe what a coach does or give the meaning of a coach? I love the definition given in the 1500's which reads, "A covered carriage that takes a person of importance from where they are to where they want or need to go."

Proverbs 18:21 states "The tongue has the power of life and death, and those who love it will eat its fruit." A coach must know how to utilize his/her words to inspire, motivate, and encourage ultimately because they desire to see that person take ownership and responsibility for the skill or concept being taught. The language of a coach has the ability to help take another person from where they are to where they desire to be.

Eric is passionate about his work at Fellowship of Christian Athletes as he trains athletes, empowering them to step into and reach their full potential in Christ. He carries that same passion into TWC to coach and train those in Level 1. Eric lives in Winnebago, IL with his wife of 9 years and 3 children.

The language of a coach can impact a person on three dimensions; body, mind, and spirit.

1st Dimension

Body – Practical applications we can apply in the training

- pacing yourself through the content of TWC
- forming an organizational method that works for you
- choosing your priorities based on your experience, focus, and passion
- identifying the best time of day that you flow and learn
- putting yourself in the best position to learn

2nd Dimension

Mind – The kingdom way of thinking that empowers right living & relationship with God.

- motivation (connecting with God's passion for us. Connecting with God's initiatives toward us)
- confidence (understanding who He is and is for us, trust in Him)
- emotions (overcoming our own negativity and passivity)
- team cohesion (owning our own growth in context of a team and seeing how it helps TWC grow as a whole)
- intensity & execution (growing in grace and love daily)
- focus/goal-setting (learning to base decisions out of identity statements, putting faith to action)

3rd Dimension

Spirit – Our innermost being or the executive center of our being

- identity (know placement in Christ, and portray who God is. live from new man consistently.)
- character (fruit of the spirit manifesting)
- values (possibilities, being joyfully intentional about our growth, abiding in Christ, empowering grace, establish NT Prophetic Culture)
- self-worth (NT grace, present/future mindset, we are defined by how God sees us and what He says about who we are)
- significance (found in identity and new man/creation we are. We are the beloved)
- purpose (our gifts are empowered from our identity)



A TWC coach will give attention to the process of developing another in all three dimensions, and when this is accomplished the following fruit will be evident:

- will be able to learn kingdom truth at an accelerated rate (quickenened spirit)
- will achieve more functionally due to their brilliant way of living relationally with God (Kingdom)
- will adapt to new conditions through exerting rest and peace (less stress, anxiety, fear)
- will be able to bounce back quicker from set-backs (humble and willing to learn/grow)
- will possess the freedom to be creative and explore the possibilities of any situation
- will have the ability to develop and establish deeper relationships with others

A TWC coach understands where they are picking someone up in their journey. They can speak to the three dimensions of a person and empower a response in that individual that will help get them from where they are (present) to where they want to be (future). For TWC, we each desire to have a more radiant idea of who God is and a more vibrant relationship that will lead us into all God has for us!

A TWC coach will help the individual take responsibility for their own journey. A TWC coach will use a common kingdom language shared among TWC and ask great questions that will serve to empower, encourage, and inspire all three dimensions of a person, ultimately leading them to discover their own voice and role within TWC and the kingdom.

Hi everyone! My name is Stacey Beebe and I live in Olympia, WA with my husband Brandon, my dog Willow, and my cat Annabelle.

I first heard Graham Cooke in 1995 (I know I'm really dating myself!) at a prophetic conference in Kansas City. As soon as he started speaking, I was hooked! There was a depth of wisdom there. I was so hungry for more of God's heart. It was also the first time I had heard of the concept of building prophets, which was so...well...BRILLIANT! I eventually lost track of him, (I didn't have easy access to the World Wide Web back then), but I never forgot the impact he had on me.

In 2007, my husband and I moved to Washington. A couple of years later I found an announcement that Graham was going to be speaking in Portland! It was a no brainer! My husband and I went to a few of his conferences before learning about and joining The Warrior Class 3 years ago, and I have been on this wild and amazing ride ever since! I am so grateful for this group that gives me the tools and encouragement to grow exponentially in relationship with the Lover of My Soul!

Becoming the Beloved: As I walked through this level, I became physically ill and eventually had to quit my job. Thanks to this Brilliant class, I was able to align myself with God's heart instead of falling into anxiety or depression. The upgrades I received in learning how to rest, how to trust, and how to expect to see God's Goodness in every situation continually blows my mind!

What part of God's nature are you discovering in this season?: In this season, I am discovering a paradox in God's nature. As I find myself in a heightened season of warfare, He is both my Endurance and my Hiding Place. I am a huge fan of The Lord of the Rings, and when I think of warfare, my thoughts often turn to any number of scenes where they were extremely outnumbered. I am simultaneously inspired and intimidated, for example, by the way Aragorn fought non-stop for days in the battle of Helm's deep, and have had many conversations with God about how one becomes so strong, proficient, focused, and enduring in warfare. And when I find myself literally knocked on the ground and can barely crawl, God, by His grace, takes me to my hiding place. A very deep place of intimacy and worship where I find rest and restoration. I am excited about my next upgrade in learning how to abide at this new level of depth!

In what way are your thoughts and language being upgraded in TWC?: A huge upgrade I have received in my thoughts is that I can honestly say I am almost incapable of becoming anxious or depressed anymore no matter the circumstances! (And believe me, this has been tested)...and this is from someone who has been on anti-anxiety meds and anti-depressants for a decade! In the rare moments an anxious or depressing thought comes into my head, I am able to easily flip that thought to an opportunity! Praise God, the old man is dead!

A huge upgrade in my language is in the area of prayer. Instead of begging and travailing in intercession, I now craft bold and joyful prayers of declaration! ...praying is a lot more fun this way!

My Identity Statement:

I am a Mary who does not hold back my love for Christ. My intimacy with Christ is a battleground against religious strongholds. (Luke 7:36-50)

I am a warrior who charges when others retreat. I can run against a troop and take the high ground with worship as my weapon and standard. I do not turn back!

I am a Jael and an Eowyn... a secret weapon in God's army. He places me with favor in the right place at the right time, and empowers me for the death blow. (Jael: Judges 4/ Eowyn: character from LOTR).

I live for the "one thing needful" and find my strength in burying my face in The Great Lion's mane.
