Graham Cooke

Graham began the weekend with sessions about the Old Covenant and New Covenant view of prophecy. His humor had everyone disarmed. He did a prophetic blessing for people who are called to do deliverance and for Seers.

Saturday morning he reminded us that the Good News is that judgment has been suspended because of the cross. The attendees were a hungry group. When he said that poverty has nothing to do with money, it has to do with living with meager possibilities.... You could have heard a pin drop.

Graham talked about how reading the Bible in a year is the most ridiculous thing he has ever heard of. Was it written in a year? Was it written in order? He said, 'Reading the Bible is necessary to find your inheritance word.' He asked if anyone did not have an inheritance word and many people stood.

On Saturday morning, he used Isaiah 61 to define true Apostolic ministry. Taking people from ashes to beauty, from mourning to gladness, from fainting to praise; that we receive a double portion for shame, and everlasting joy for humiliation. That the call of the Apostolic is "to rebuild cities and to gather in places where the enemy thinks he is lord." If you are part of a franchise (speaking about Apostolic networks) you only own a part. If you are a steward, you own it all! "If you build a franchise, kingdom decreases." This is not about defending turf, it is about authenticity. People are placed in your arena because God trusts you with their freedom.

On prophecy: "Prophecy interrupts patterns of thinking." ... "Prophecy ends need for prayer." Now you have a promise and that is money in the bank. You can trade that in on the answer to your prayers. Prophecy IS the answer. "Go after it – don't wait around for it."

On Saturday night, Graham prophesied about the low places.

**"Trust your heart towards Me.
Don't put Me on a high place; let Me be in a low place with you.
Sometimes God is your keeper; sometimes he is your healer.
In all things, it is still grace."**

He called up those that were in low places – 75% of the audience stood. He declared a spirit of wisdom and revelation over us, and redefined hope – astonishing expectation of God. If you are in Christ, so are your circumstances. "God schedules conflicts," then calls you up to your inheritance word.

If I were to describe Graham's words this weekend I would say "Palpable" - as defined: "clear to the mind, plain to see, able to be felt."

What did God upgrade most in how you see yourself as a leader?

God is working on upgrading me in so many ways that it is hard to narrow down “as a leader.” I think living authentically, asking questions in the process and exploring without needing to know the final answer are highlights for me. Report on Chosen Camp, Suffolk, England

August 5-9 2015-08-09

Armed with the Prayer Points that TWC sent out for this assignment, I went to the Camp expecting great things and hoping to meet Graham and Theresa.

Graham took the first session on Wednesday night talking about transformation and how God is making us in His image, for us to be exactly like Him. How he plans to take us outside our comfort zone and that as everything goes to the cross it emerges differently. Death is the starting point for life. Not only is my life changed but as I begin to see people as God sees them, I become a life changer too. My 'old man' is dead!

Graham then picked up the theme again by encouraging us to work on the new man, not the old man. We must seek the Lord as we are His habitation, and it is His grace that enables us to become the person that God sees when He looks at us. God sees us through the lens of Jesus, in the fullness of Christ. God sees what's missing from what we are becoming. We need to change our mindset from defeat and negativity to a righteous mindset that can only focus on what's new. To get victory over the old man we need to learn to be an overcomer in all situations, to find out what Jesus is praying until we become "more than a conqueror." Only the Truth will set us free. Identity is the key to transformation.

On Friday morning Graham picked up the theme that prophecy is all about how God sees us. That God doesn't talk to us, He talks in us. We pray with God, not towards God. He then beautifully expounded on Grace from Eph 1:3-8 sharing that grace is the empowering Presence of God that allows me to become the person that God sees. He talked about being given promises and that when we get a promise from God that is the end of prayer and the beginning of proclamation. He said that you "confess" a promise, you 'declare' it to the enemy, and you "proclaim" it to heaven. We exult in the fact that God is wonderful towards us. We exult in His glory. We give thanks until we become thanks. If we practice exultation as a way of life, we'll be permanently excited! Grace is the place of our empowering. No-one loves us like God, no-one delights in us like God. Grace is a ruling power. Grace is about who we are, who we choose to be and how we show up.

In the evening Graham concluded by taking Eph 1:3-11 and Rom.8:14-17, 29-30. God initiates everything and we respond. Our performance comes after God has initiated something first. Father God is looking at Jesus in us and asking, "What do you need?" We are heirs as children. Ask and keep on asking. The world needs us to come into our inheritance, and our inheritance always comes in the form of a promise. Going into the wilderness is about getting the next part of our inheritance. The wilderness is where God takes us when he is happy with us!

He then spoke from Ps 91. He encouraged us to examine and practice meditation. He said that God delivers us from fear of warfare, and that we would learn to stand up under religious oppression. Intimacy with the Lord is the most intimidating thing about us on the battle field. That we need a majesty mindset to win a battle and Jesus never loses. Victory is about getting over ourselves, getting over the “old” man and taking on the mind of Christ.

Saturday morning finished with a celebration of what God had done and is going to do. Both Graham and Steve shared briefly and to summarize:

- We are called higher to go further.
- We are called to be the resurrected life in the church.
- The ashes of our journey are the beauty of our future.
- A seed has to die in order to become what it is destined to be.
- In the place of restraint is the fullness of the discovery of who we are called to be.
- Press into God for the fullness of transformation; inside the Spirit is unlimited infinity.
- God only deals with the new man.
- Holiness is not about dealing with sin, it's about loving righteousness.
- Be renewed in the spirit of your mind, by becoming God-conscious.
- Become involved with Who Christ is for you, in you and through you.
- Live from that place of revelation and you will receive new experiences of God's lovingkindness and grace.
