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
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An event with Judith MacNutt of Christian Healing Ministries entitled Ignite! I was requested to speak specifically on "Resting In the Lord." In my first message I spoke on the "Renewal of Rest", which describes the value that Heaven places on rest and peace since the dawn of creation. Man's first day was a day of rest where God rested on the 7th day. The precedent and the principle were set from the very first day of life for mankind. It's possible to track the promise and presence of rest all the way through Scripture.



My next message was concerned with, "The Practice of Rest", which examines how we enter and abide in the resting place of God. Lots of practical examples about rhythm and schedule, and developing a godly routine of maintaining a restful lifestyle.

In the 3rd session I was going to talk about, "The Overcoming Rest" but the Holy Spirit did a number on me as I stepped onto the platform. He whispered an idea as I was being introduced and I followed the rabbit trail to a freeway and spoke on "Identity and the Journey Into Fullness." It kind of exploded in the room, altering perceptions and mindsets and creating a language that empowered people to understand where they were currently and how to move forward into a greater dimension of identity and the resources already allocated to our calling. This message will expand into an interstate highway, there is no doubt.

My final message was about "The Fruit of the Spirit", which is fast taking on the dimension of a legendary message. It creates so many keys that unlock the often troubling scenarios that exist across the relational landscape and gives great tools to help people navigate that emotional scene.

I enjoy CHM and their holistic approach to life in the Sprit in a vexing world. Worship was great. Fellowship was sweet. I am with them next in Florida for a Women's Conference...dangerous territory!

Faith Center in Great Falls, Montana

An oppressive city. Altitude sickness and a huge passivity was waiting for me as I landed in the late, very late evening in Great Falls, Montana, continuing the tour of the places very few people want to go to do meetings.

I met Nick and Robin Gough, vibrant pastors of the Faith Center, an energetic church seeking to pursue Kingdom spirituality and overcome a religious mindset rooted in the old man. When the new man lifestyle is proposed to a people who have never really considered the fullness of what Jesus gave His people; it is initially always resisted. The resistance is not because people cannot recognize the new. It is because it clashes so violently with legalistic, one-dimensional mindset that some people have been subjected to for years.

Let's follow through on this one by continuing to declare:

- New lenses to see that everything with God is relational.
- Freedom to trust the God who can be trusted.
- Courage to believe and step up into new levels of exploration.
- An exchange of "what's wrong" for "what's missing and what God intends to provide."
- A fresh focus to look UP at possibilities instead of down at losses.

We release:

Keys that disempower disillusions and loose limitless possibilities.

False teaching, poor doctrine and unhelpful traditions are the true battleground where we must take action to set Christians free.

The best way to fight a legalistic spirit is with the Spirit of Goodness, Kindness, Joy, Rest etc. Tell the truth about Jesus, tell stories against yourself, make people laugh and enjoy the radiant idea of God. Speak in a restful way that allows people to relax.

A legalistic spirit keeps people in a knife edge of fear, guilt and shame. They become locked down into a place of low self-esteem in Christ, feeling unworthy and not able to approach God. They are sin conscious and do not feel accepted in the Beloved. Often they cannot hear the voice of the Lord for themselves and live largely in a place of passivity on the borders of unbelief.

This was something of the climate I faced in this region. Many people, in the church for decades, had never/seldom heard these truths expressed. They had no radiant idea of God and their spirituality was more functional than relational.

Jesus came to open prison doors and set captives free. Fascinating that He did not specifically talk about that in the Sermon on the Mount but rather chose the setting of His hometown church to talk about the specific anointing that was upon Him for the sake of freedom.

In three deliberately chosen messages: "Freedom In Christ", "The Language of Heaven", and "Passivity Into Prophecy" - the Holy Spirit mercilessly went after a religious/legalistic spirit. It was a fight! A physical, mental and spiritual conflict that was a full-on assault sleepless nights, violent headaches, nausea and a blanket of fatigue that sapped the energy.

In regions like this where there is a large territory with few people, the religious one holds sway in a different way. It is unchallenged, very powerful, rooted in the practice of church - harder to shift. Time will tell if the breakthrough is established. I left the leaders with an assignment to follow through. I hope they pick up the sword.

Danny gave one of the best talks on honor I have ever heard, and I've heard a few! He blew away the prejudice and controlling mindset of everyone in the room. I felt refreshed in the Presence of the Father who values us more highly than most people will ever experience or understand.

Spending time with Danny was a joyful experience, the like of which I have seldom experienced at events in the U.S. It was fellowship of a rich kind; open, honest and humble, yet full of laughter. Two guys sat on a rooftop celebrating their escape from the stifling confines of legalistic Christendom, reveling in the grace and truth of Who Jesus really is for us and....oh, so grateful for a present/future guaranteed with Presence...always.

An unexpected joy in this space is how much my girls & hubby love it to. And having them in it is wonderful. I have my space where I belong & shares such value!



I have promises about being a fire starter of campfires around which people gather to share stories, roast hot dogs and gain warmth.
