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Abiding In His Heart

Do you hear the call? Do you recognize the sweet invitation to go to a deeper place in God's heart? It's a place where we learn to abide, or remain, in Him.

I love the secret place of His heart. Learning to "be" in Him has been one of the most powerful weapons I have ever welded. In that deep recess of His heart, I know His goodness and grace. I am protected from the winds, storms and waves.

I have found the ability to abide has kept me in a place of clarity and purpose. It has allowed me to be sensitive to His timing and remain in His protection. Abiding has given me the strength to choose Him no matter what. It's where I remember, He is God and I am not.

In my life, I have often had to make the difficult choice of following God or pleasing others. As rising warriors, we will be faced with this choice, as well. In those moments, we will have to consider the cost of choosing Him over another's plans or preferences. It's in those circumstances we will know if our training to abide in Him holds.

We have a call as a new breed of warrior.

We have an invitation to be like Joshua, who stayed in the presence of God even as Moses walked out of the Holy of Holies to head home. We have the invitation to practice abiding in Him so we will not waver in the face of that choice.

In this season of connecting deeply to Him, we are drinking in the very presence of His love. In seasons to come, what we have trained in now will be lived out. Then, when faced with the touch choices, we will speak, move and love from the place of abiding deeply in His heart.

The Rhythm of Training

Where are you in your training? Are you in a flow, ebb or transition time? What does that mean for your rhythm and the practical side of "living the training out?"

We have a large variety of training options* in our community. Moving through the different options requires choice and a connection with God's heart for the timing of what comes next.

In our performance driven cultures, we often assume that we need to be working on a training level/module or we are not training. The reality is the whole process of our journey is about training.

Part of being a warrior and a champion is learning how to recognize where you are in the process. Through our training journey, you are discovering more clearly the value of knowing where you are in the process. Identifying where you are helps your intentionality with how you approach your day to day in that season.

We have identified three major stages to the rhythm of your training. Knowing these will help you understand more about where God has you and what that means.

<u>Flow:</u> You train in the information, get sparked in the understanding, revelation, perspective shifts, etc. This is where you are actively seeking input, moving through the processing questions and enjoying what the level/module training is opening before you. Many times, encounters with God are happening and it's a very exciting time. You have an invitation to transform.

Ebb: You have a lot of information you are assessing:

- What have you just learned through the training?
- ➤ What are all the new perspectives and upgrades you have just gained?
- What has God revealed about you and what has He revealed about Himself?
- ➤ How do those new things apply to your life?
- ➤ What it looks like to practice them in your life?



Within an ebb, you are learning to describe what has changed in you and what that change looks like in your day to day. This timeframe can be longer or shorter depending on how much or how deeply those shifts have gone. In addition, even with great depth of change, the timeframe may also be shortened depending on how much acceleration God has for you in this season. God's presence may recede a bit or may become a much more intimate time of being with Him. You are transforming.

<u>Transition</u>: The transition stage is when what you have learned becomes a part of you. Many times, God seems more reserved as He gives you the time for these changes to become a part of you. You integrate these things into your life in a way that they become part of who you are. You live from this revelation rather than toward it. It has become a part of who you are. You have transformed.

One example is in flipping the negative. In flow, you are learning what this means and how powerful it is. In ebb, you are recognizing the authority you have to use this tool and are constantly reminding yourself to practice flipping the negatives in your life. In transition, you start to realize you are seeing the flip first rather than having to walk yourself through the process. You immediately jump to the possibilities and the outcome because that is what you see when you look at the challenges before you. This tool now becomes part of who you are and it becomes a more automatic response in times of pressure.

We have a plethora of tools. God has a storehouse of provision, and there are numerous ways to access and apply all we have.


My part/God's part opens the door for intimacy and empowers us to intentionally partner with God in everything we do and everywhere He is. He points us to which training to practice when, how and where, and our part is to engage.

It reminds me of David; a shepherd boy killing a lion and bear in preparation for God's dream of being King. David walked his path, oblivious to God's plan, but doing it anyway. Then he receives a promise, God's dream that he would be king. As he comes to this realization he becomes more intentional. Before battle, he asks God how to proceed, asks what God is doing and how he can partner in victory, and every time God's approach is different. David doesn't assume the same thing every time, but is intentional in pursuing his relationship with God.

Every situation and circumstance calls for a different response and approach. David screwed up too and guess what? David's mistake wasn't powerful enough to change God's mind, dream, or love for David.


The most important thing in life is knowing Him. When Jesus asks us the question, "Who do YOU say that I am?" With great JOY we can answer according to our experience of Him.



About Me:



I began this journey with TWC in July 2016, and I'll never be the same – a good thing for sure. The road has been diverse on a daily basis... from overwhelming, frustrating, and painful, to exciting, freeing, and joyful. Ultimately, leading to the ongoing process of transformation.

My husband and I recently celebrated our 40th anniversary. We have been blessed with a wonderful family including our son, daughter, and 4 beautiful granddaughters. Western Nebraska has always been my home. I grew up in a very small town (population 100), and now live in a rural farming community surrounded by the natural beauty of hills, plains, and amazing wildlife.

Becoming the Beloved:

When I first read Allison Bown's book *Joyful Intentionality*, I was abruptly stopped on page xi of the Preface where she wrote, "When we connect with the passion that God has for and extends to us..." I was shaken by that comment... "God has passion for me?" That was a new and astounding concept for me, and I had to find out if it was true. I have been exploring (or mining, as Allison calls it) ever since. And I have discovered that it is indeed true, but the truth of it runs deep – deeper still – and I've only touched the tip of the iceberg.

I have struggled with becoming the beloved, feeling like I'll never arrive. Only to learn from Graham that "there is no place to get to – you're already there...you're in Christ – rest, relax, and rejoice." Currently I am in a Psalm 46:10 season where God has pulled me aside and the focus is "Be still and KNOW that I Am God."

I can only describe the process of Becoming the Beloved as "multifaceted." Each day brings new discoveries and ancient truths. In that process I am being transformed into a new wineskin – being prepared to receive the new wine that He is pouring out.

1 John 4:10 The Passion Translation (TPT)

This is love: He loved us long before we loved him. It was his love, not ours. He proved it by sending his Son to be the pleasing sacrificial offering to take away our sins.

My New Kingdom Language:

When I joined The Warrior Class I felt like I had stepped into a strange culture that spoke in a foreign language. Insteads, crafted prayer, intel, upgrades...what were they talking about? Not to mention creating an atmosphere, inheritance words, identity statements, key territories, and evidences of transformation. As I started to learn this new dialect, one phrase quickly became my favorite - "permission granted." Permission to fail, to wait, to ask questions, and to say "no." Permission to laugh, to love, to be joyful, and to dream big. I have found so much freedom and healing in "permission granted."

It is taking time and practice to become fluent in this new Kingdom language. But as my vocabulary expands daily, it is becoming a part of my lifestyle and my identity.

My Identity Statements:

At this time I am focusing on what I call my "foundational" identity statements. This is a new season for me. One of not only learning to be still, but also going deeper, along with simplifying and getting back to the basics. My desire is to become more assured of my identity in Christ, and to rest in Him.

- ➤ I am a child of the Most High God. (John 1:12)
- ➤ I am loved by the King. (1 John 4:10)
- ➤ I am a friend of God. (John 15:15)
- ➤ I am My Beloved's, and My Beloved is mine. (Song of Songs 6:3)
- ➤ I have been invited to an intimate "tea time" with the King, in the secret place. I am seated and resting in the heavenly places. (Eph. 2:6)
